

Acts 2:1–21

John 14:23–31



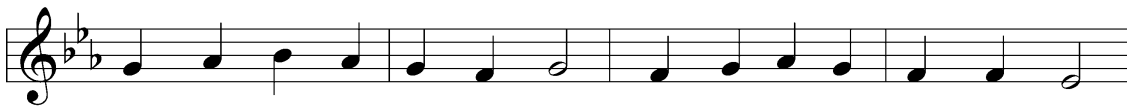
